

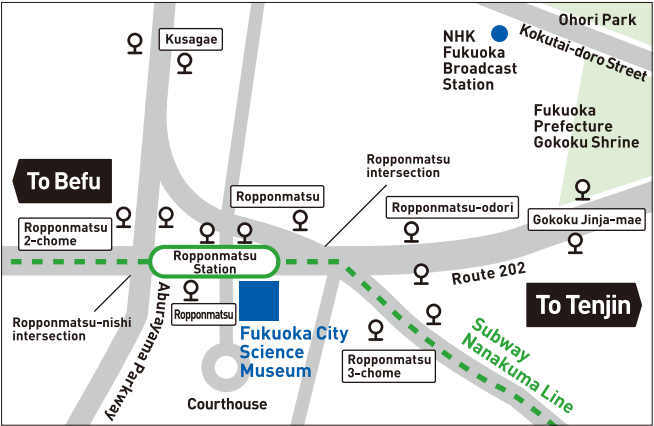
Message from the Honorary Director of the Museum

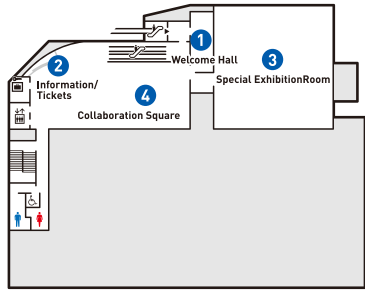

## Collaboration Square

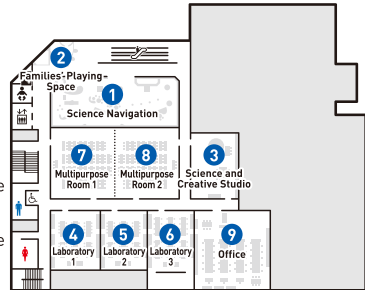
Collaboration Square presents the features and mechanisms of technologies possessed by local firms, mainly through hands-on exhibitions.

### Organisms

Explore the mysteries of life by learning about medical technology, the structure of the body, and biological evolution.

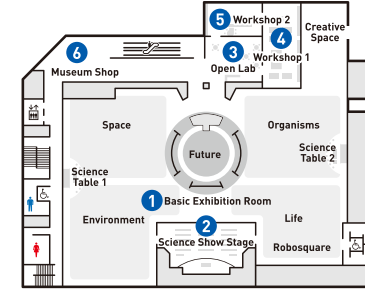

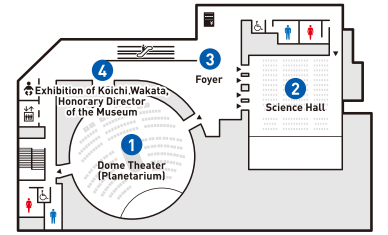

## Dome Theater (Planetarium)

### —One of the largest of its kind in Kyushu

A cutting-edge optical projector and a high-resolution (8K equivalent) digital projector produce true-to-life images that recreate the starry sky incredibly close to how it appears naturally.



The Dome Theater has an environment that allows for comfortable viewing; the dome measuring 25 meters in diameter is among the largest in Kyushu, and the 220 seats are arranged spacio-
